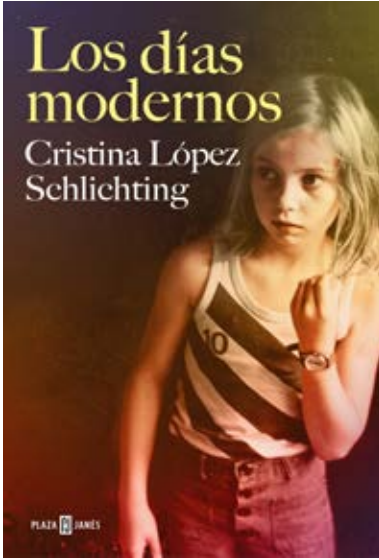

Valeria is a writer in crisis, both with her novels and her incredibly hot husband who is never there. Thankfully, her three best friends: Carmen, Lola and Nerea support her through her adventures, while having adventures of their own. Valeria and her friends are immersed in a whirlwind of emotions about love, friendship, jealousy, unfaithfulness, doubts, heartbreak, secrets, work, worries, joy and dreams of the future.

Valeria lives in Madrid, where she worries, cries, laughs and dreams of the future, while Lola wonders what to do about Sergio, Nerea is tired of being Nerea the Ice Queen and Carmen has quit her job and struggles to understand Borja, her boyfriend and former colleague.

Each of their lives takes a turn, but they persist in searching for their own happy ending.

A newcomer to the world of swingers, with a free pass to a new sexual universe. Could love be open up beyond the confines of a couple? Could sex be a team sport?

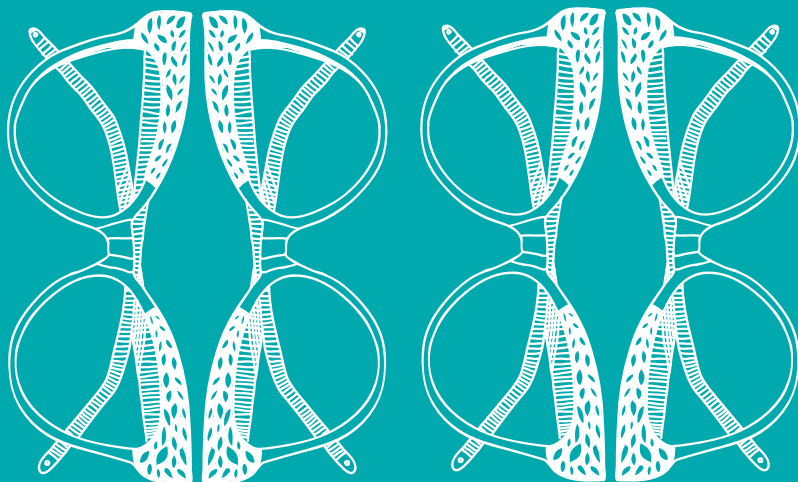

When Men Arrive

In the fullness of her career, Marian Izaguirre unveils the story of two women tangled by their secrets, pasts and destinies, despite the time that separates them.

Fencing, recipes, forbidden loves, loneliness and the fear of abandonment, along with the strength of complicity and the desire to know, unite the lives of two women who never met, but who share the same destiny.

A portrait of a beautiful, distant woman, –Teresa– who lived alone in a hotel by the Costa Brava, her childhood days with her mother Ángela –a lovely person whose heart was always open to love– and an old box filled with letters written in the early 20th century by a distant relative named Elizabeth.

The lives of Teresa and Elizabeth are the two time lines of the story; complemented by a third: the childhood of Teresa in Bilbao and her moving to the Mediterranean.

Every Day Was The Same

Five women. Five interwoven stories of their time spent in prison. A narrative pacing, similar to that used in TV series: increasingly valued and enjoyed by contemporary readers.

A nun who stole children, a whore disowned by her family, a Colombian woman sentenced for drug trafficking and a prison guard who wanted to be a dancer have something in common with Inma, the protagonist: the experience of prison and the unhappiness caused by those who pushed them to make the mistakes they did.

There they are: chatting in the yard or lining up in the dining room. Different women come and go because prison is a transitory place, where routine and memories of an unfortunate past maintain an imposing presence.

They seem just inmates, living each day the same. It takes a closer look to discover their splendid uniqueness.

A look at the network of hierarchies, prejudices, loyalties and betrayals, through a portrait of the Spanish generation born in the 1970s and 80s.

After their father's death, Marta and Sofia go to their family home to deal with his things. Their reencounter with his possessions brings back memories of their life. *Wolf Skin* is two stories in one: the transformation of that town over the last thirty years, and the attempt to reconstruct a life. The need to find a place where they belong and an identity to call their own. It depicts a Spanish generation, and its attempt to adapt to the new circumstances: a society in perpetual crisis and constant change that forces them to reconsider everything they've been taught.

Dark Embraces

Even if locked up, the past always comes back and takes its toll. A story where desire, intrigue and suspense settle in the life of a happily married woman.

Seen from a bit of distance, Virginia seems like a woman who's comfortably settled into a life she chose for herself after years of adventures: now she has Alex, a fabulous husband, two small daughters who adore her, and a career that fills her days. When you get closer though, you can see a strange hunger in her gaze, one that isn't sated by the typical kisses and caresses. Daniel, a shadowy man, senses that Virginia's desires have deep-seated roots, and he knows how to tame them.

Was leaving the past behind worth it? Was it necessary to forget whom we were, to save only those pieces of life that show the best of us?
